1. Background:

Cinryze is a plasma-derived C1 esterase inhibitor (human) indicated for routine prophylaxis against angioedema attacks in adults, adolescents and pediatric patients (6 years of age and older) with hereditary angioedema (HAE).¹

2. Coverage Criteria^a:

- A. Cinryze will be approved based on <u>all</u> of the following criteria:
 - 1. Diagnosis of hereditary angioedema (HAE)

-AND-

2. For prophylaxis against HAE attacks

-AND-

3. Not used in combination with other products indicated for prophylaxis against HAE attacks (e.g., Haegarda, Takhzyro, Orladeyo)

Authorization will be issued for 12 months.

^a State mandates may apply. Any federal regulatory requirements and the member specific benefit plan coverage may also impact coverage criteria. Other policies and utilization management programs may apply.

3. Additional Clinical Programs:

- Notwithstanding Coverage Criteria, UnitedHealthcare may approve initial and re-authorization based solely on previous claim/medication history, diagnosis codes (ICD-10) and/or claim logic. Use of automated approval and re-approval processes varies by program and/or therapeutic class.
- Medical Necessity and supply limits may be in place.
